

"Oh, for a beaker full of the warm South..."

e trust we have managed to find some excellent new additions to tempt you this year – some old friends, others exciting new discoveries – some 33 in all marked with\* in the text. These include the spectacular new *Cyclamen hederifolium* Red Sky (page 10), the sinister Cobra Lily Arisaema griffithii (page 6) and an unknown delightful dwarf white *Iris sibirica* (page 25) which has grown here for 30 years.

I am writing this in late November and our tunnel is still ablaze with **Nerines** (page 27) which have been delighting us since the end of August. At the moment it is a mass of glowing pink **Hera** that is centre stage but towering above them all are our two introductions. Both are the product of intensive plant breeding programmes for the cut flower industry. **Elegance** has huge deep salmon pink flowers held on very stiff stems. The other is the result of crossing amaryllis with nerine. The fabulous **Amarine Belladiva** (page 4) takes the best from each parent and has the bonus of being hardy. Both flower for a long time.

An amazing number of our familiar summer flowering bulbs originated in S Africa, from an area of summer rainfall (does that sound familiar?). Having grown them for many years here I hope to see some of them in the wild in the New Year. Amaryllis, Crocosmia, Crinum, Dierama, Eucomis, Gladiolus, Galtonia and Nerine all



started there, also the early flowering **Watsonia** on page 38. Add in **Agapanthus** and **Kniphofia** and, as John Keats so elegantly puts it, your garden can truly be a beaker full of the warm south.

## **AGAPANTHUS** (African Lily)

Easy, trouble-free perennials forming large clumps of narrow leaves and round heads of flowers in late summer. Feed in spring with Tomorite. **Many more varieties will be found on our website.** 

**NOTE:** We sell mature plants NOT plugs and although most have flowered here they may not flower in the first year after moving; they need time to settle.

### **DECIDUOUS VARIETIES FOR BORDERS OR POTS**

These are **deciduous** with clumps of narrow leaves and are free flowering. They are fully hardy in well drained soil in full sun. Established plants flower best. A winter mulch is beneficial in cold areas. Protect from frost if grown in pots.

#### **★** ΔIMFF

Our own introduction. Medium sized white flowers with a delicate blue rim to 3 of the petals. Very distinct. 30" July £8.00 each

#### **BEN HOPE**

One of the excellent 'Royal' series, producing masses of well shaped, mid blue flowers. One of the earliest to flower. Good front of border plant. 36" July £5.50 each; 3 = £14.50

#### **BLUE IMP**

Compact with masses of almost electric blue flowers in tight heads. 30'' August 45.50 each: 3 = 414.50

#### **BLUE MOON**

A truly magnificent plant, long admired here. It is the last to flower, with huge grey-blue flowers on stiff stems. 4' Late Aug-Sept f7.00 each: 3 = £18.00

#### **BRESSINGHAM BLUE**

Vigorous plants producing a mass of intense blue compact heads. Late flowering, 30" Aug-Sept £5.50 each; 3 = £14.50

#### **BUCKINGHAM PALACE**

The deep blue flowers are carried on 5ft stems. Ideal for the back of the border as at Wisley. 5' July-Aug £5.50 each: 3 = £14.50

#### **HEADBOURNE BLUE**

**HYBRIDS** (Palmer Hybrids). Showy clusters of mid-blue flowers. Very hardy. 36" Aug-Sept £4.50 each; 3 = £10.50

Dense heads of the most delicious ice blue. Vigorous and free flowering.

## EVERGREEN VARIETIES FOR CONTAINERS

**Evergreen** varieties are best grown in pots which are kept frost free. They produce fewer but larger flower heads and have large, leek-like clumps of leaves. They are all large mature plants.

#### **ENIGMA**

One of the very best. Huge heads of white flowers that have brilliant blue bases. 3' August £8.00 each

#### **JACK'S BLUE**

Spectacular and free flowering, with large heads of rich purple-blue flowers. Late flowering. 4' Aug-Sept £6.00 each

#### **PRAECOX**

The Scilly Isles agapanthus with huge heads of mid blue flowers. 5' August £8.00 each

#### **PRAECOX ALBIFLORUS**



## **ALLIUM**

We offer here semi-evergreen varieties which prefer to be planted at this time of the year. The onion smell only occurs when the leaves are bruised. They are all easy to grow in light, well drained soil and full sun. Clump forming.

## **ANEMONE**

Although a full range of bulbous and rhizomatous species can be found in our Autumn catalogue, we offer here some of the more unusual herbaceous varieties.

#### **MULTIFIDA** (magellanica)

As its name implies it comes form the far south of S America. Clumps of hairy divided leaves give rise to a succession of stems bearing 3-4 cream flowers all summer. Easy in any sunny position.

#### x LESSERI

A lovely dwarf Anemone with a succession of deep rose-carmine flowers above ferny leaves. Ideal for the rock garden or front of border. 8" May-July £4.00 each

## SYLVESTRIS (Snowdrop Anemone)

Large fragrant white flowers above clumps of well-divided leaves over a long period. Best in a cool, semi-shady position.

## **ARISAEMA**

These attractive and unusual relations of our own Lords and Ladies are becoming increasingly popular. They are quite hardy and require a cool soil that does not dry out. A covering of bracken is beneficial in cold areas. The 'flower' is in fact the spathe, the true flower being inside it.

#### **♥** CANDIDISSIMUM

A quite outstanding Chinese species with white flower spathes broadly striped with pink. Prefers a sunnier position than the rest. 12" May-June £8.00 each

#### **GRIFFITHII** (Cobra lily):

The huge tubers give rise to large, hooded 'flowers' followed by handsome leave. Light, moist soil in shade. 14" April-May £5.00 each

#### **SIKOKIANUM**

## **ASPHODELINE**

Although natives of the Mediterranean area, these striking plants are easily grown in any sunny position in well drained soil.

#### **LIBURNICA**

Slender spikes of lemon yellow flowers above feathery, basal leaves. Plants originated from Great Dixter. 3'-4' Summer f.4.50 each: 3 = f.12.00

#### **LUTEA**

Clumps of attractive narrow bluegrey evergreen foliage with spikes of striking star-like golden flowers. Unusual in that the flowers open irregularly over the whole spike, giving a prolonged flowering period. The seed heads are an attractive extra. 36" May-June £4.50 each: 3 = £12.00

## **ARUM**

These curious plants are becoming more and more appreciated. They require a rich soil and plenty of water when in growth.

#### **CRETICUM**

## CARDIOCRINUM

A monocarpic lily needing a very rich soil in semi-shade with plenty of moisture. Produces offsets to grow on for future years.

#### S GIGANTEUM

Spectacular heads of nodding white bells with a red throat. Heavily scented. May take two or three years to flower. The ultimate height depends upon growing conditions. 6'+ July Large rooted bulbs in pots. £9.00 each

## **CAMPANULA**

Easy plants for a sunny border, each producing a succession of large, showy flowers all summer.

#### **X** KENT BELLE

An amazing plant which produces a succession of intense, violet-blue nodding flowers all summer.

Clump forming.

#### **TAKESIMANA**

## **CRINUM**

Hardly a small bulb but we are regularly asked for these popular summer flowering bulbs from S Africa. Plant in full sun with the neck of the bulb above the soil. They will look dreadful in the winter but resist the temptation to tidy up until the new leaves start to poke through in the spring.

#### **▼ x POWELLII ALBUM**

The huge bulb produces large clusters of long leaves and a succession of white, trumpet shaped flowers in mid-summer. Clump forming – my enormous one produced 26 stems this year! 3' Aug-Sept £6.00 each; 3=£16.50

## **CROCOSMIA**

Once included under Montbretia, these plants appreciate a little humus on planting and prefer shade for at least part of the day. They do not flower well in hot dry conditions or deep shade. Excellent for extending the season into late summer.

#### CANARY BIRD

We found a stock of this lovely deep golden Crocosmia in a local garden. Although we know no more of its history than its name, it is a very fine plant. 24" Aug-Sept 3 = £4.50: 10 = £13.75

#### **CITRONELLA**

Clear lemon-yellow flowers and pale leaves – a must for the autumn garden. The true plant. 24" Aug-Sept 3 = £4.50; 10 = £13.75

## CONVALLARIA (Lily of the Valley)

These favourite and attractive plants will grow outside in almost any situation, but prefer a humusrich loam in shade. When once established the crowns increase well and the larger ones flower every year. Scented.

#### S BORDEAUX

A truly giant Lily of the Valley with flower spikes nearly 12" tall May-June £3.00 each; 3 = £8.35

#### **▼** MAJALIS 'FORTIN'S GIANT'

A robust and spectacular form. A much better doer than the ordinary C. majalis. 10" May-June 5 = £3.50

#### **CYCLAMEN**

Hardy Cyclamen in general are far better planted as growing plants than as dormant bulbs. Due to the fragility of their leaf stalks we prefer to despatch late in their growing season when they are naturally dying back. All tubers are dug daily for immediate despatch. All Cyclamen require a humus-rich soil that is well drained. They are summer dormant — an annual top dressing of bone meal and leaf mould or composted bark is beneficial. All varieties have distinctive leaves which are very variable and give great interest in the garden, both before and after the flowers appear. Except for Cyclamen repandum (see description) they should be planted with the tops of the tubers one inch below the soil surface. They prefer to be planted as under:

The delicate parent of all the well-known indoor hybrids. Slender pale rose or white flowers with a deep carmine base. Often scented. Easy in glasshouse. 6" Feb-Apr £5.00 each

A very beautiful, large, violet-carmine flower. Strongly marbled leaves with red underneath. Hardy in sheltered gardens. 5" Feb-Mar £5.00 each; 3 = £14.00

## PURPURASCENS (europeum)

**S** This native of the Alps is only rarely offered. It grows best in dry shade such as under a viburnum. The strongly scented carmine flowers are produced in succession.


